






Survey in Conference Folder Ecologically Impactful Sites



Survey about potential research project on ecologically impactful roadside revegetation

Some University of Northern Iowa Biology Department faculty and Tallgrass Prairie Center faculty and staff are considering applying for a grant to develop a tool to identify county roadside sites where native revegetation would have the greatest ecological impact (e.g., maybe in terms of connecting habitats, or being in a location where pollinators or brids are most likely to use the planting). But to know if this would be a worthwhile project, we want to learn if such a tool would be useful to you and if you would be able to implement the results.

Please answer the following three questions.

- 1. Would you find a tool that identifies the most ecologically impactful roadside locations to revegetate with native plants in your county to be useful?
- 2. In a typical year, are you mostly planting natives on projects that are road department priorities (e.g., road regarding, ditch cleanouts) or are you sometimes able to prioritize plantings based on perceived ecological impact? What percentage of your plantings represent road department priorities and what percentage is other priorities?
- Are you interested in helping us understand your needs so we can develop a funding proposal to create a tool for identifying the most ecologically impactful sites in your county? Please provide your name and email if you are.
